Admission/Academic Requirements

- A program fee (\$500) per semester will be assessed to all students who have been accepted in the professional phase of the program of the MS ATEP.
- Students must meet all Graduate School requirements in addition to program requirements.

MS in HNES: Entry Level Athletic Training Program Requirements:

Admission Requirements:

1. A Bachelors of Science degree in a related field from an accredited institution
2. Undergraduate overall GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
3. Acceptance into the NDSU Graduate School

Academic Requirements:

1. Minimum of 50 hours of observation under a BOC ATC in an athletic training room setting
2. Minimum of "C" or higher in the following college courses:
 - a. Human Anatomy/Lab
 - b. Human Physiology Lab
 - c. Exercise Physiology/Lab
 - d. Kinesiology/Biomechanics/Lab
 - e. Nutrition
 - f. Psychology
 - g. Personal/Community Health
 - h. Current Professional Rescuer First Aid/CPR/AED card

Application Process:

1. Must meet the minimum Admission and Academic requirements listed above
2. Submission of MS ATEP application
3. Interview with MS ATEP Application Committee
4. Physical exam signed by physician
5. Technical Standards form signed by physician
6. TB test and Hepatitis B vaccine (or Hep B waiver)
7. Additional paperwork (as needed by clinical affiliations)

Application does not constitute acceptance into the program. Admission requirements are not weighted. Therefore, no single admission requirement has a deciding factor on the applicant's acceptability in to the MS ATEP. Exceptions to the requirements can be made on recommendation of NDSU MS ATEP Application Committee. Acceptance is NOT guaranteed simply upon satisfactory completion of the admission and academic requirements.
